Design Build 2019 Broke Records with more than 400 High School Builders

Twenty-seven high schools competed in the 2019 Design Build Competition at Cosumnes River College - an all-time record for the number of schools as well as the number of student builders.

Nearly 300 industry professionals attended the Industry Lunch on the second day of the competition to cheer on the high school builders and were greeted by Mayor Darrell Steinberg. Other speakers included David Lucchetti of Pacific Coast Building Products, Assistant Superintendent Matthew Perry of the Sacramento County Office of Education, Kelley Cowan of XL Construction, Nils Blomquist of DPR Construction, and Eric Witcher of Northern California Tile & Stone.

Nearly \$20,000 in scholarships and community grants were awarded at the lunch. Recipients of the 2019 Construction in the Community Grant included Fairytale Town's Adventure Playground, The Girl Scouts Heart of California's Under Construction Program and the North State Building Industry Foundation's Project My Own Bed.

Recognizing the need for a well-trained workforce in the construction industry, the Construction Industry Education Foundation (CIEF) sponsors an annual Design Build Competition. The event is designed to promote career awareness and create a fun learning experience for high school students. Following defined criteria provided by CIEF, each team completes the challenge of designing and preparing construction documents for their structure. Schools compete in one of two categories: the Shed Competition or the Open Competition. Construction of the structure takes place at the competition site over a two-day period. A panel of architectural and construction professionals from the greater Sacramento area serve as judges. Structures are judged on the students' ability to perform all the functions of the project including planning and design, scheduling, overall project management, craftsmanship, teamwork and safety. CIEF and the construction community provide **all of the materials** needed for each team participating in the Shed Competition and most of the materials needed for each team participating in the Open Competition to complete their project. Schools may keep their completed project and use it themselves or they may sell it to fund other school projects. Many projects in recent years have been donated to regional nonprofit organizations.
